Secondary Plus

S1-S4

Our Secondary Plus courses for \$1-\$4 students focus on developing authentic English and will equip you with skills that you can use in exams and the world beyond the classroom.

These **project-based courses** prepare you so that you can become a competent user of English. Through research, presentation and collaboration, you will gain a vital set of skills – and the confidence to use them. You will:

 be exposed to rich and meaningful real-world language use

· carry out engaging and relevant tasks

 enjoy dynamic lessons on real-life topics that will prepare you for a global world. The courses improve your understanding of the lives and cultures of others and how these compare with your own (an important part of building multiple perspectives). They also develop your citizenship, critical thinking and leadership skills.

Academic and exam skills are integrated into each module. Real world topics and language skills are matched with local school curricula and the demands of school exams. You will:

- gain confidence in speaking English through activities such as presentations, fun debates, vlogging and interviews
- practise the skills and strategies you need for success in school exams
- develop life skills such as collaboration and leadership to help you succeed in the future whilst having lots of fun along the way.

You will participate in online and in-class activities to develop and revise your language skills and follow a curriculum that supports personal growth by treating you as an individual.

- discuss issues critically, form opinions and express your views and arguments convincingly with suggestions
- learn to use appropriate gestures, facial expressions, intonation, eye contact and formulaic expressions to create engaging presentations
- learn ways to organise your information and arguments and learn how to express your views precisely.

Learning outcomes

You will:

- make suggestions, develop the ideas of others, disagree and offer alternatives in group discussion
- extend answers by giving facts and examples in individual responses
- increase your range of vocabulary and language patterns
- learn how to improve your fluency and accuracy so that you sound more natural.

Writing Skills

S3-S4



This course aims to develop your writing skills for different genres such as biographies, stories, formal and informal emails, product reviews, articles, scripts and reports.

What is this course like?

You will:

- draft, review and edit your writing in order to ensure that you are using the most appropriate vocabulary, tense, style and register
- widen your range of vocabulary through reading comprehension tasks, matching exercises, writing and discussions
- learn to write a wide range of texts for different audiences
- receive written and oral feedback from the teacher on how to improve.

Learning outcomes

You will:

- present different views and arguments logically and clearly
- use a range of discourse markers such as 'although' to show the development of your ideas
- improve your vocabulary and familiarity with different text types.

S5

What are these courses like?


You will:

- practise gist and focused reading, presentation skills, and writing succinctly to express your message to your audience
- receive personalised feedback on your performance and development.

- improve your knowledge of language patterns and vocabulary
- become more familiar with the questions and text types you have to deal with in the DSE exam
- increase your confidence in writing and speaking.



Learners aged 16 and above*

Our IELTS courses give you the confidence and skills required to get the score you need in the IELTS test.



IELTS Language Preparation Programme (Academic Module)

If you would like to combine your language competency with a focus on exam techniques and skills, then IELTS Language Preparation is the ideal course for you. You will:

- follow a Cambridge IELTS course book that is tailored to suit your current English level and needs
- receive clear advice from an expert teacher about each section of the exam, and tips on how to best approach the test questions
- focus on how to write effectively and speak skilfully in order to score well in the exam.
- practise language and vocabulary specific to the exam so that you can maximise your potential score
- develop an awareness of common topics and questions that will help you feel more relaxed on the day of the test
- have access to free online IELTS skills modules for Speaking, Writing, Listening and Reading, plus grammar and vocabulary that targets the needs of Chinese learners.

IELTS Coach (Academic Module)


