 - Set up an UK account preferably in HK
- Electronic devices

- Clothing (note: UK weather is cold and rainy)
- Skincare, haircare
- Home comforts
- Things you can't buy in UK
- Food from home

Don't overpack! You can buy most things in the UK!





Things to buy in UK

- Stationery
- Toiletries
- Household times
- Cooking utensils
 - Rice cooker! (or you can bring it instead)
- Course materials
- SIM cards (Three, Vodafone, Orange, O2, Virgin Mobile, giffgaff)
 - Many offer student discounts (e.g., £16/month for 30GB)
 - Compare for deals, coverage, monthly contract vs pay-as-you-go
