

Who are UCAS?

- An independent non-profit charity.
- The UK's centralised admissions service for undergraduate higher education.
- Provide impartial information and advice about higher education in the UK.
- Process over ½ million applications each year including 140,000 from outside the UK.
- Not responsible for making decisions on applications nor advising students where to apply.


Get organised:

When to apply*





May	18 May 2021 — Apply opened for 2022 entry.
September	7 Sept 2021 — first day to submit applications.
October	15 Oct 2021 — deadline for Oxford, Cambridge, medicine, dentistry, or veterinary medicine/science.**
January	26 Jan 2022 — deadline for undergraduate courses.**
June	30 June 2022 — last day to apply with five choices.**

^{*}Please note all dates are subject to change. ** All at 1800 UK time.

Apply key facts

- Application is entirely online.
- Maximum of five choices.
- Some restrictions:
 - Maximum of four choices for medicine, veterinary science/medicine, and dentistry.
 - Can only apply to either Oxford **or** Cambridge.
- Simple application cost:
 - One choice £22.
 - Two to five choices £26.50
- Equal consideration if deadlines are met.
- Invisibility.










Making an application

Sections to be completed:

- Personal details
- Contact and residency details
- Work experience
- Education
- Nationality details
- English language skills
- Supporting information
- Personal statement
- Choices make up to five
- References
- Finance and funding



Decisions



Track

An admissions tutor can make one of three decisions:

- unconditional
- conditional
- unsuccessful

A student may also be asked to:

- attend an interview
- produce a portfolio
- take an admissions test



Replying to offers



If all conditions are met, this is where a student will be placed.

Insurance

Usually lower conditions in case the firm conditions are not met.


Other offers

All other offers must be declined at this point.




